MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

A quorum was present and Arthur Obar (chair) called the meeting to order and introduced new member Tanya Burt with Enviva Pellets. Donnie Read led the invocation and Arthur Obar led the pledge to the flag. Lauren Morris recorded attendance.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Arthur Obar asked if there were any public comments. He stated that Lauren Morris had the public comment cards if anyone needed one.

EMERGENCY ITEMS

Arthur Obar asked if there were any emergency items. He noted that there were none from the staff. There were no emergency items from the board members.

CONSENT ITEMS

Arthur Obar requested a motion to move the Status of Funds report toward the end of the agenda. Donnie Read made a motion and Raymond Russell seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous to move the Status of Funds report agenda item.

Donnie Read made a motion to approve the minutes from the Board Meeting on July 11, 2019. Raymond Russell seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous to approve the minutes from the Board Meeting on July 11, 2019.

NATIONAL DISLOCATED WORKER GRANT

Rose Adams presented an update on the National Dislocated Worker Grant. She gave an overview of job sites and the number of workers in each county. There are currently twenty-five worksites and eighty-four active workers enrolled in the program, with three additional labor positions advertised. Seventy-nine individuals have obtained unsubsidized, permanent employment since beginning of the grant.

CAREER PLACEMENT CENTER

Rachael Poole presented an update on the Career Placement Center at Chipola College. She gave an overview of outreach activities, stating that 512 students have been reached from June 1, 2019 – September 19, 2019. Ms. Poole shared that outreach efforts include classroom presentations, open house, nursing orientation, resume and interview preparation, job search assistance, Career & Life Planning class, and more. Sarah Clemmons stated the college is pleased with the partnership.

OJT CONFLICT OF INTEREST DISCLOSURE FOR BOARD MEMBERS

Debby Wood shared that CSC is currently accepting applications from employers for the On-the-Job Training Program. She stated that interested members should notify the board, declare a conflict of interest, and request an application for the program. Richard Williams added that any contracts with board members would come back before the board for approval, then require state approval as well.

OPPORTUNITY FLORIDA DUES

Richard Williams gave a brief overview of the Opportunity Florida mission and the relationship between CSC and Opportunity Florida. He requested approval of payment of \$10,000 for the 2019-2020 membership dues. **Janice Sumner made a motion to approve the request. Raymond Russell seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous to approve payment of Opportunity Florida membership dues.**

2019-2020 BUDGET

Richard Williams presented a rundown of the proposed 2019-2020 budget. He stated that the biggest change on the income side is the NDWG funding. He said that the budget is reflective of what is anticipated to be used as the program ramps down, rather than the amount of funding that may be available overall. He also stated that there is more funding available if needed, should the program pick up speed again.

Williams pointed the performance funding carryover from the second round of the Performance Funding Model awarded by the state. He said that funds from the third round were recently released and awarded to CSC for ranking second in the state in the performance-based measures.

Next, Mr. Williams mentioned differences in the equipment/furniture line and noted that difference is a result of the available performance money being used for much needed updates and replacements of equipment and furniture. He stated that the additional funds on the equipment maintenance and license line reflects the IT updates in progress.

Williams shared that the increase in the marketing and outreach category is primarily allocated to the ad campaign created by The Moore Agency, as previously approved by the board, focused on recruiting and retaining local residents for local jobs.

The decrease in rent, as mentioned by Williams, is reflective of the Early Learning Coalition now paying rent directly to Florida Panhandle Technical College, rather than to CSC, who in turned passed it to FPTC.

Mr. Williams next brought attention to the salary and fringes line of the proposed budget. He stated that, when OPS individuals operating the NDWG program were removed, there was a decrease in this line. He then stated that the proposed budget for this line included a 3% raise for staff, with a \$1,000 cap, based on performance reviews and merit. Williams also said that in the past, 10% of performance funding has traditionally been allocated for staff in the form of bonuses to reward and encourage high performance and the chance of securing additional performance funding in the future.

Williams stated that the increase on the supplies line is primarily due to the supplies and equipment being purchased for NDWG participants.

He also mentioned increases in travel and training and board-related items, which he stated are to ensure both staff and board members have appropriate opportunity to attend training and conferences such as the NAWB Forum. A general discussion followed.

Larry Moore made a motion to approve the budget. Jesse Smallwood seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous to approve the 2019-2020 budget as presented.

EXTENSION OF QLM CONTRACT

Richard Williams reviewed the current contract with Quality Labor Management as employer of record for the NDWG program, providing payroll and workers' compensation services. He stated that it has been an excellent partnership and recommended that the contract be extended through September 30, 2020, as allowed in an option written into the contract. **Raymond Russell made a motion to approve the request to extend the contract. Donnie Read seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous to extend the contract with QLM through September 30, 2020.**

IN-SCHOOL YOUTH PROGRAM MODEL

Debby Wood provided an update on the request sent to DEO and CareerSource Florida to approve a waiver of the regulatory requirement to serve 75% out-of-school youth as well as the 20% work experience expenditure requirement. While the waiver was denied, Ms. Wood shared that DEO/CareerSource Florida directed CSC to provide a youth service delivery model and proposed budget that would allow the state to provide additional funds to serve the in-school youth population. A general discussion followed. **Janice Sumner made a motion to approve the request for the board to direct staff to develop a service delivery model and budget for in-school youth services. Travis Ephriam seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous to develop the service delivery model and budget as recommended by the state. Prior to any discussion, Sarah Clemmons, Larry Moore, and Donnie Read declared a conflict of interest and abstained from discussion and voting.**

IT INFRASTRUCTURE BIDS

Richard Williams stated that while some bids have been received, there have not yet been enough in any one area to bring them before the board. He stated that as bids are received, a phone meeting may be called to review them, with the permission of the chair. No action was needed on this item.

STATUS OF FUNDS REPORT

Mr. Williams presented the Status of Funds report and stated that it was prepared based on the previously presented budget. He also stated that there was an issue with the LVER and DVOP veteran positions, as the state has decreased the passthrough with no notification. CSC staff are addressing this with the state to find a resolution.

DIRECTOR'S COMMENTS

Richard Williams asked board members to updated contact information to ensure correct information is available both for our purposes and for reporting to the state. He next mentioned the most recent financial monitoring. He stated that there were no findings, and three observations. One observation was on the financial side of operations, while the other two were tied to processes and were caused by recent staff changes. Mr. Williams also shared that the state workforce board chair will be visiting our area with some elected officials shortly after the anniversary of Hurricane Michael to keep some attention on the area. Next, Williams addressed discrepancies in labor force participation rates following Hurricane Michael versus the numbers being reported by the state. He stated that he has made contact with the USDOL and discovered that vendors creating the reports are not removing institutionalized individuals as required. He stated that the numbers are being run again with those individuals removed, and that participation rate numbers may be better than some larger, more urban areas. Mr. Williams briefly mentioned data protection and issues local school boards have recently faced. He then mentioned mental health in the time following Hurricane Michael. He stated that area employers are noticing mental health issues in employees. Williams also noted that he will be coordinating with Life Management to set up meetings for CSC staff, if needed.

BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

Jesse Smallwood shared the recently implemented Veterans' Court being held in Panama City. Debby Wood stated that CSC DVOP Chris Bailey is regularly attending the hearings and has been a valued contributor in the Veterans' Court process.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to discuss, Arthur Obar adjourned the meeting.

**SPONSORSHIP OPPORTUNITY: NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF WORKFORCE BOARDS
NATURAL DISASTERS AND WORKFORCE SYSTEM RECOVERY CONFERENCE**

Background: The nation's federal, state and local workforce systems face unique challenges with post-disaster recovery. Hurricanes, tornados, floods, fires and earthquakes leave business disrupted as well as the lives and incomes of the citizens of those areas. The workforce system's response, through disaster unemployment, temporary jobs to assist in recovery, and assistance to the business community, are often challenged by the very environment after the disaster. On top of these formidable obstacles, the circumstances and assistance needed may face additional limitations imposed by federal laws and regulations that further impede recovery assistance.

The National Association of Workforce Boards (NAWB) is interested in hearing about the unique situations and challenges that state and local systems have encountered, the solutions that they implemented and the shortfalls that they could not solve. How can NAWB advocate to improve the workforce system's response? This conference is about learning the stories, solutions and additional help that our federal, state and local systems need to improve their response to business and the citizens that are affected.

NAWB is inviting state and local workforce boards from states that have been impacted by these natural upheavals to tell their stories. These include Florida, California, Texas, Mississippi, Iowa, Kansas, Arkansas, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama, Louisiana and Missouri.

CareerSource Citrus Levy Marion, whose CEO is a member of the NAWB Board of Directors, is coordinating the logistics of the conference, along with Kim Bodine, Executive Director of CareerSource Gulf Coast. There will be no registration fee to encourage maximum participation, so NAWB, CareerSource Citrus Levy Marion and CareerSource Gulf Coast are seeking sponsors to defray the costs of the Conference. CareerSource Florida is covering costs associated with facilities, an optional tour on the afternoon of January 8th, and other related expenses. Sponsorships are being sought to cover a pre-conference networking reception and luncheon and other related conference expenses.

Staff Recommendation: Approval of a \$5,000 event sponsorship to help defray the costs of the conference.



Due to the volatile market, in an effort to save all parties involved (Owner, General Contractor, Electrical Contractor and NCS/Network Cabling Services, Inc.) and added cost associated with the continuous rising cost of all copper wire. The pricing is based on drawings provided by the customer in includes 191 CAT6 drop with a mix of 1, 2, 3, 4 & 6 port locations. This quote is broken out for 2 locations. **The Marianna location does not include any rack or equipment except for 5 each 48 port patch panel and a corresponding horizontal cable manager. This quote includes 55,000 feet of CAT6 cable. I want to make everyone aware that there may be a requirement to add a small equipment box in the farthest office area to insure the length meets with testing requirements.** We will need to test the longest drop for length. If this fails we will need to provide a change order for the additional work.

The 2nd part of this quote is for the Blountstown office and includes 30 drops per the areas discussed in our joint site survey. This one includes a rack along with a 48 port patch panel. Both Vertical and Horizontal management is included in this quote.

This proposal is based on JSC Systems, Inc.:

1. Furnishing material, wire and labor for installation for the above scope of work. We shall provide wire, system devices and complete final control panel terminations, with the exception of Main 120VAC power wiring, which are to be supplied and installed by your firm.
2. Furnishing City / County / State permit fees, if applicable. We shall not be responsible for any AHCA review fees.
3. Furnishing, owner and maintenance manuals as required.
4. Providing termination of central equipment, programming, testing, and owner instruction for the above referenced systems..

This Contract is between the **CareerSource Chipola**, hereinafter referred to as "CSC", whose address is 4636 Highway 90 East, Suite K, Marianna, Florida and **Jackson County School Board**, hereinafter referred to as "Service Provider", the address of which is 293 Jefferson Street, Marianna, Florida, for the express purpose of provision of services pursuant to the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) of 2014, the Workforce Innovation Act of 2000, and any other programs administered by CareerSource Chipola and funded within this Contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, promises, and representations contained herein, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

ARTICLE I. SCOPE OF SERVICES

The Service Provider, in a satisfactory and proper manner as determined by the CSC, shall carry out all activities as agreed upon in this Contract for Services. Such activities shall be performed, except as otherwise specifically stated herein, by persons or instrumentalities solely under the dominion and control of the Service Provider. The purpose of this Contract is to fully implement the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signed on June 18, 2019, by CSC, the Service Provider, and Tri-County Community Council. Whereas the MOU outlined areas of performance to be supported by CSC, this agreement provides the mechanism by which the Service Provider may bill for expenses previously agreed upon in the MOU as well as future expenses that benefit the agreed upon project.

ARTICLE II. PERIOD OF CONTRACT

This Contract is effective upon both parties signing and the Service Provider shall complete performance on or before June 30, 2021, unless this Contract is terminated as herein provided. In the event that the funds on which this contract is dependent are withdrawn, this contract may be terminated at CSC's option and CSC has no further liability to the Service Provider beyond that already incurred by the termination date and within the limits of unpaid funds that were not withdrawn.

ARTICLE III. TERMS OF CONTRACT

The total amount of funds in this Contract is \$ 225,000. It is understood that these funds will be used to fund teaching and support staff for the building construction trades special project operated by the Jackson County School Board. Teaching and support staff shall be limited to one instructor and one teaching assistant. With prior written approval of CareerSource Chipola funds may also be used for instructional materials, supplies, program outreach and other expenses necessary to carry out the goals and objectives of the program.

ARTICLE IV. INDEMNIFICATION

The Service Provider is an independent Service Provider and shall carry out and execute its duties and responsibilities under this Contract as an independent Service Provider. In discharging such duties and responsibilities, Service Provider shall exercise due and responsible care and shall comply with all assurances contained herein. The Service Provider agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold CSC, its officers, agents, and employees harmless and blameless from liability of any kind whatsoever, including costs, reasonable attorney's fees, and expenses which arise out of, or are the result of performance or non-performance of this Contract and any claim whatsoever arising out of the contractual relationship.

ARTICLE VI. PAYMENT & PERFORMANCE

This is a reimbursement and performance-based contract. All performance should be completed and invoices submitted to CSC by June 30, 2021. The amount listed for each item reflects the amount that will be available to be paid to the Service Provider upon verification by the Contractor that the deliverable has been completed.

Deliverable 1: Value: \$125,000

Required Items: Hiring of primary instructor. Notification to CSC of hiring and a statement with each subsequent invoice stating the instructor was still employed for the billing period.

Deliverable 2: Value: \$100,000

Required Items: Hiring of teaching assist. Notification to CSC of hiring and a statement with each subsequent invoice stating the teaching assistant was still employed for the billing period.

Any item other than reimbursement of instructional salary payment will require written prior approval of the CSC, documentation of the expense, and documentation the primary instructor was employed at the time the expense was incurred.

For any billing after January 31, 2020 the Service Provider shall include a list of students enrolled in the program. All students enrolling in the program shall be made available to

CSC for the purpose of possible enrollment in additional job training programs funded by CSC.

ARTICLE VII. AUDITS

a. Non-Profit, Governmental and Education Entities

If this award is made to a non-profit, governmental or institution of higher education, and if this Service Provider receives \$750,000 or more in a fiscal year in federal financial assistance to operate a federal program, the federal cost principles and audit requirements of 2 CFR 200 shall be adhered to. The Service Provider shall provide for a program specific independent financial and compliance audit conducted and prepared in accordance with generally accepted government auditing standards.

b. Commercial Organizations

If this award is made to a for-profit commercial organization, and if this Service Provider receives \$750,000 or more in a fiscal year in federal financial assistance to operate a federal program, the Service Provider shall provide for a Single Audit or program specific independent financial and compliance audit conducted and prepared in accordance with generally accepted government auditing standards.

c. Audit and Monitoring Reports

- 1) Service Provider shall submit a copy of their independent audit report within thirty (30) calendar days after its receipt and not later than nine (9) months after the end date of this Contract.
- 2) If an official audit or monitoring report identifies unacceptable accounting practices and/or records management, CSC reserves the right to withhold any or all reimbursement from the Service Provider until such time as the accounting practices and/or records management are improved to the satisfaction of CSC.
- 3) The Service Provider will implement a system for monitoring fiscal, participant and program activities for compliance with this Contract. The Service Provider will maintain documentation to verify completion of monitoring activities.
- 4) The Service Provider will respond in writing to monitoring reports and requests for corrective action plans in the allotted timeframe after receipt of the monitoring report from CSC.

ARTICLE VIII. RECORD KEEPING

The Service Provider will be responsible for maintaining all financial records, supporting documenting and any other documents (including electronic storage media) pertinent to this contract for a period of three (3) years from the date of the final payment of this Contract, or until all audits are complete and findings on all claims have finally been resolved, whichever is longer.

The Service Provider will cooperate with CSC to facilitate the duplication and/or transfer of any said records or documents during the required retention period. If the Service Provider is unable to retain the records for the required period, the Service Provider will notify CSC in writing and request instruction. The Service Provider shall not dispose of any records with the prior written consent of CSC.

ARTICLE IX. MODIFICATION, AMENDMENT, TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

- A. This Contract may not be modified, amended, canceled, extended, or assigned orally without the express written consent of the CSC board or Executive Director of CSC. All modifications, amendments, cancellations, extensions, or assignments must be reduced to writing and incorporated into an amendment hereto.
- B. This Contract is subject to termination by CSC on thirty (30) days advance notice to the Service Provider at its address as hereinabove specified.
- C. Termination for Lack of Funds: In the event funds to finance this Contract are reduced, suspended, or terminated in whole or in part, the obligation of each party hereunder may be terminated upon no less than twenty-four hours' notice in writing by CSC to the Service Provider.
- D. Termination for Breach: Either party may terminate this Contract when it has determined that the other party has failed to provide any of the services specified herein in a timely or proper fashion, or has violated any stipulations of this Contract. If the Service Provider fails to perform, in whole or in part, or to make sufficient progress so as to endanger performance, CSC will notify the Service Provider of such unsatisfactory performance in writing. The Service Provider has thirty (30) working days from receipt of notice in which to respond with a plan agreeable to CSC to correct said deficiencies. Upon failure of Service Provider to respond within the appointed time or failure of Service Provider to respond with appropriate plans, CSC will serve a termination notice that shall become effective within fifteen (15) days after its issuance.

In the event of such termination, CSC shall be liable for payment only for services rendered prior to the effective date of termination. Final billing for payment must be received by CSC within thirty (30) days of the termination date.

The Service Provider shall give CSC written notice of any perceived breach and it shall give CSC thirty (30) working days to cure any perceived breach under this Contract.

- E. Termination for Convenience: Performance under this Contract may be terminated by either party for convenience when it is in their best interest. Any termination for convenience will be preceded by written notice setting forth the effective date of said termination. The termination shall be effective ninety (90) days after the notice is issued and the Service Provider has ninety (90) days after the effective date to bill for payment. The Service Provider shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any services performed hereunder through the date of termination or suspension.
- F. Termination (Other): Unearned payment under this Contract may be suspended or the Contract terminated upon the refusal by the Service Provider to accept or comply with any conditions that may be imposed by the United States Department of Labor, the Department of Economic Opportunity, Workforce Florida, the Governor, or CSC at any time.

The submittal of false information may be considered fraud and could result in the immediate termination of the Contract.

This Contract shall be interpreted under the laws of the State of Florida.

- G. CSC may extend the terms of this Contract by written notice to the Service Provider. CSC shall give the Service Provider a preliminary written notice of its intent to extend at least sixty (60) days before the Contract expires. The preliminary notice does not commit CSC to an extension.

If CSC exercises this option, the extended Contract shall be considered to include this option provision. The Contract may be renewed on a yearly basis for a period of up to two (2) years after the initial Contract specifying the terms under which the cost may change as determined in the RFP. Renewal shall be contingent upon satisfactory performance evaluations and the availability of funds. The total duration of this Contract, including the exercise of any options under this clause, shall not exceed three (3) years.

ARTICLE X.

The Parties agree to comply with all provisions and perform all services as set forth in this Contract.

The Service Provider shall maintain its books, records and documents (including electronic storage media) in accordance with generally accepted accounting procedures and practices which sufficiently and properly reflect all revenues and expenditures of funds provided by CSC under this Contract. The Service Provider shall track costs in sufficient detail to determine compliance with applicable laws and regulations and to ensure that the funds have been lawfully spent. All expenditures must be in accordance with the applicable OMB Cost Principles. The Service Provider shall maintain separate accounting records for funds received and expended under this Contract.
6. All purchasing of goods and services must be in compliance with CSC procurement guidelines or the Contractor's procurement policy, if the Contractor's policy is approved in advance. Records must be maintained to document procurement efforts to comply with this requirement.

5. The use of contract funds to purchase equipment, as defined by 2 CFR 200, is prohibited without prior written approval of CSC. The Service Provider shall maintain an up-to-date inventory of all property purchased under this Contract. All such property shall be returned to CSC, unless otherwise authorized in writing by CSC. No such property shall be disposed of without written authorization from CSC.
6. The Service Provider shall establish and maintain an auditable accounting system and report on an accrual basis in accordance with recognized accounting practices and CSC's requirements for fiscal and program reports. This includes establishing record keeping systems that are sufficient to permit the preparation of reports required by the State of Florida and CSC, and to permit the tracing of funds to a level of expenditure adequate to insure that the funds have not been spent unlawfully.
7. The Service Provider who is a public or private non-profit agency assures that revenue in excess of costs shall be treated as program income. Accordingly, these funds may be retained by the Service Provider to underwrite additional training or training related services pursuant to the project or program that generated them. Funds not spent during the Contract period shall be returned to CSC within thirty (30) days of the expiration date of the Contract.
8. The Service Provider agrees to comply with OMB Circular 2 CFR 200 – Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards.
11. The Service Provider shall implement administrative controls to identify participant training costs that are supported by other federal (DOL, Pell Grants, VA, etc.) state or local programs to ensure that costs are not being duplicated. Coordination and sharing of costs is strongly recommended. The education institutions financial aid officer is to report the specific amount and description of financial aid awarded to each WIOA participant after enrollment and this information must be documented in the participant's file.
12. The Service Provider assures that clarification will be sought from CSC on any policy, law, rule or regulation/directive that is not clearly understood prior to adopting any practice or procedure.
13. The Service Provider understands that CSC will give the Service Provider thirty (30) days to take corrective action should it be determined that there is a violation of the law. If corrective action is not taken by the Service Provider, funding will be withheld or revoked.
9. The Service Provider understands that evaluations of participant progress during training will be documented in a timely manner not less than monthly in the participant's file.
10. The Service Provider agrees that conditions of employment or training shall be appropriate and reasonable with regard to the type of work, geographical region, and skills of the participant. No participant will be trained or receive services in buildings or surroundings which are unsanitary or dangerous.
11. The Service Provider assures that work-based training participants will be provided the same working benefits at the same level as other employees similarly employed.
12. The Service Provider assures that to the extent that a State Workers' Compensation Law is applicable, workers' compensation benefits in accordance with such law shall be provided and paid for by the Service Provider. To the extent that such law is not applicable, each recipient of funds under WIOA and the Welfare Transition Program regulations shall secure insurance coverage for injuries suffered by such participants.
13. The Service Provider understands that CSC shall assume no liability with respect to bodily injury, illness or any other damages or losses, or with respect to any claims arising out of any activity under this Contract whether concerning persons or property in the Service Provider's organization or any third party.
14. The Service Provider assures that it will develop monitoring procedures to ensure that its program is in compliance with the WIOA Laws and that adequate administrative and accounting controls are being used.

15. The Service Provider will adhere to and comply with CSC's Complaint and Grievance Procedures, approved by the Department of Labor's Office of Civil Rights.
23. The Service Provider shall be liable for prosecution under the criminal provision of the 18 U.S.C.665 for theft or embezzlement of WIOA funds.
24. The Service Provider shall maintain the confidentiality of any information regarding CSC customers and the immediate family of any applicant or customer, that identifies or may be used to identify them and which may be obtained through application forms, interviews, tests, reports from public agencies or counselors, or any other source. The Service Provider shall not divulge such information without the written permission of the customer, except such information which is necessary as determined by CSC for purposes related to the performance or evaluation of the Contract, may be divulged to CSC or such other parties as they may designate having responsibilities under the Contract for monitoring or evaluating the services and performances under this Contract, or to governmental authorities to the extent necessary for the proper administration of the law. All releases of information shall be in accordance with applicable state laws and policies of CSC. No release of information by the Service Provider, such release is required by federal or state law, shall be construed as a breach of this Contract.
25. The Service Provider will comply with all applicable requirements of all other Federal laws, executive orders, regulation and policies governing these programs.
26. The Service Provider agrees to comply with the Veteran's Priority of Service Provisions (38 U.S.C. 425 and 20 CFR 1010).
27. The Service Provider agrees to comply with the Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000, as amended (22 U.S.C. 7104(g), 2 CFR 175).
28. The Service Provider agrees that no funds under this Contract may be used in support of any religious, anti-religious or political activity.
29. The Service Provider will comply with the Hatch Act (5 U.S.C. 1501-1508 and 7328) which limit the political activities of employees whose principal employment activities are funded in whole or in part with Federal funds.
30. The Service Provider will comply with requirements pertaining to copyrights (agreements which involve the use of copyrighted materials or the development of copyrightable materials) 625.420(h)(4)(i), and will comply with requirements pertaining to rights of data, 627.420(h)(4)(iii). CSC, the Department of Equal Opportunity and CareerSource Florida shall have unlimited rights to any data first produced or delivered under this Contract (Agreements which involve the use/development of computer programs/applications, or the maintenance of databases or other computer data processing programs, including the inputting of data.)
31. The Service Provider will comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act, (42 U.S.C., 12101 et. seq.) which prohibits discrimination by public and private entities on the basis of disability in employment, public accommodations, transportation, State and local government services and in telecommunications.
32. The Service Provider will comply, as applicable, with the provisions of the Davis-Bacon Act as amended (40 U.S.C. 276a-7) and as supplemented by Department of Labor (DOL) regulations 29 CFR Part 5, the Copeland Anti-Kickback Act (40 U.S.C. 276c and 18 U.S.C. 874) as supplemented by DOL regulations 29 CFR Part 3, and the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 U.S.C. 327-333) as supplemented by DOL regulations 29 CFR Part 5, regarding labor standards for federally assisted construction sub-agreements.
33. When applicable, if this Contract is in excess of \$100,000, the Service Provider shall comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued under the Clean Air Act as amended (42 U.S.C. 7401 – 7671q) and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1251-1387), as amended. Any violation of

these Acts should be reported to CSC and the Regional Office of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).

34. The Service Provider understands it is illegal for any corporate entity to punish whistleblowers or retaliate against any employee who reports suspected cases of fraud or abuse (Sarbanes Oxley, Section 1107, Section 1513 of Title 18, USC). In addition, it is a crime to alter, cover up or falsify, or destroy any document that may be relevant to any official investigation (Sarbanes Oxley, Section 1102, Section 1512 of Title 18, USC).
35. In compliance with WIOA Public Law 113-128, Section 194 (15) none of the funds provided under this title shall be used by a recipient or sub-recipient of those funds to pay the salary and bonuses of an individual at a rate in excess of Executive Level II. This restriction does not apply to vendors/contractors providing goods and services as described in NPRM 683-290(c).
36. The Service Provider shall comply with mandatory standards and policies relating to energy efficiency which are contained in the State of Florida's energy conservation plan issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act, Pub. L. 94-163.
37. A person or affiliate who has been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime may not submit a bid on a contract to provide any goods or services, may not submit bids on leases of real property, may not be awarded or perform work as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor, or consultant under a CSC contract for a period of thirty-six (36) months following the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list.
38. The Service Provider shall fully comply with nondiscrimination and equal opportunity laws, Section 188 of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 (WIOA), which prohibits discrimination against all individuals in the United States on the basis of race, creed, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, disability, political affiliation or belief, and against beneficiaries on the basis of either citizenship/status as a lawfully admitted immigrant authorized to work in the United States or participation in any WIOA Title I financially assisted program or activity and the Service Provider agrees that it shall comply with Executive Order (EO) No. 11246, Equal Employment Opportunity, as amended by EO No. 11375, and as supplemented in Department of Labor regulation 29 CFR parts 33 and 37 as well as 41 CFR part 60 and 45 CFR part 80, if applicable, including the Nontraditional Employment for Women Act of 1991; Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended; Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended; the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended; Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended; Section 654 of the Omnibus Reconciliation Act of 1981, as amended; and with all applicable requirements imposed by or pursuant to regulations implementing those laws.

The Service Provider further agrees that it will in no way discriminate against, deny benefits to, deny employment to, or exclude from participation any person on the basis of race, color, religion, sex (including pregnancy), sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, sex stereotyping, national origin, age, disability, marital status (except as otherwise permitted under Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972), political affiliation or belief, citizenship status as a lawfully admitted immigrant authorized to work in the United States, from any program or activity funded in whole or in part with funds made available through CareerSource Chipola. It is also agreed that participation in programs and activities shall be open to citizens and nationals of the United States, lawfully admitted permanent resident aliens, refugees and parolees, and other individuals authorized by the Attorney General to work in the United States. It is further agreed that the grievance and complaint procedures submitted by the grant recipient and approved by the Office of Civil Rights will be adhered to.

Programs funded through CareerSource Chipola are equal opportunity programs and the Service Provider shall assure that all programs and activities conducted under this Agreement are accessible to individuals with disabilities. Where the physical facilities are not accessible, an alternate plan for accessing the program or activity must be developed and retained on file, and a copy provided to the CareerSource Chipola Equal Opportunity Officer. Provisions must also be made for the limited English speaking and

vision and sensory impaired. These provisions include: having a plan to provide interpreters and sign language assistance when necessary, and assuring that adequate staff or other sources are available to adequately communicate with non-English speaking applicants and/or participants.

CareerSource Chipola has established and maintains procedures to informally resolve grievances or complaints from, and provide counseling to participants in programs operated under this Agreement. A representative of the Service Provider will be required to inform program participants of such procedures and their right to file with the appropriate local, State, or National entity a complaint if the matter is not resolved through informal procedures. The Service Provider agrees to require that each participant read and understand their rights and responsibilities as enumerated in the Notice of Nondiscrimination and Complaint and Grievance Procedures Form.

Sub-recipients shall not discharge or in any manner discriminate against any individual in connection with the administration of the program, or against any individual because such individual has filed any complaint or instituted or caused to be instituted any proceeding under or related to this Act, or has testified or is about to testify in any such proceeding or investigation under or related to the Act, or otherwise unlawfully deny to any individual any benefit to which that participant is entitled under the provisions of the Act or privileges secured by 29 CFR Part 34.

39. The Service Provider shall not employ an unauthorized alien. The employment of unauthorized aliens is a violation of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 USC 1324 a) and the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986 (8 USC 1101). Such violation shall be cause for unilateral cancellation of the Contract by the Board as specified in the Contract.
40. If the Contract contains federal funds and the Service Provider provides services to children up to age 18, the Service Provider shall comply with the Pro-Children Act of 1994 (20 USC 6081). The Service Provider shall immediately report knowledge or reasonable suspicion of abuse, neglect, or exploitation of a child, aged person, or disabled adult to the Florida Abuse Hotline on the statewide toll-free telephone number (1-800-96ABUSE). As required by Chapters 39 and 415, F.S., this provision is binding upon the Service Provider and its employees.
41. The Service Provider and any of its subcontractors shall comply with applicable Federal, State and local Child Labor Laws.
42. Contracts or agreements for the performance of experimental, developmental or research work shall provide for the rights of the Federal Government and the recipient in any resulting invention in accordance with 37 CFR part 401, "Rights to Inventions Made by Nonprofit Organizations and Small Business Firms Under Government Grants, Contracts and Cooperative Agreements," and any implementing regulations issued by the awarding agency.
43. Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 U.S.C. 3701-3708) - Where applicable, all contracts awarded by the non-Federal entity in excess of \$100,000 that involve the employment of mechanics or laborers must include a provision for compliance with 40 U.S.C. 3702 and 3704, as supplemented by the Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 5). Under 40 U.S.C. 3702 of the Act, each Service Provider must be required to compute the wages of every mechanic and laborer on the basis of a standard work week of 40 hours. Work in excess of the standard work week is permissible provided that the worker is compensated at a rate of not less than one and a half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of 40 hours in the work week. The requirements of 40 U.S.C. 3704 are applicable to construction work and provide that no laborer or mechanic must be required to work in surroundings or under working conditions which are unsanitary, hazardous or dangerous. These requirements do not apply to the purchases of supplies or materials or articles ordinarily available on the open market, or contracts for transportation or transmission of intelligence.
44. Avoidance of Conflict of Economic Interest – An executive, officer, agent, representative or employee of the Service Provider will not solicit or accept money or any other consideration from a third person or entity for

the performance of an act reimbursed in whole or in part by this Contract. No member of any Board of Directors under the WT Program/TANF or WIOA shall cast a vote on the provision of services by that member or any organization that the member directly represents or vote on any matter, which would provide direct financial benefit to that member.

- 45. The failure of CSC to strictly enforce any of the provisions of this Contract, or require strict performance by the Service Provider of any of the provisions herein, shall in no way be construed to be a waiver of such provisions or any other validity of this Contract or any part hereof, or waive the right of CSC to enforce each and every provision here.
- 46. The Service Provider understands that CSC has the right to terminate this Contract by written notification when an extenuating circumstance arises, for example when the work is no longer required. It is understood that the Service Provider will be compensated for work already completed or in the process according to accurate appropriately submitted documents.
- 47. This Contract is subject to termination by CSC with thirty (30) days advance notice in writing to the Service Provider. In the event funds to finance this Contract are not available, the obligations of each party hereunder may be terminated upon no less than twenty-four (24) hours' notice in writing by CSC to the Service Provider
